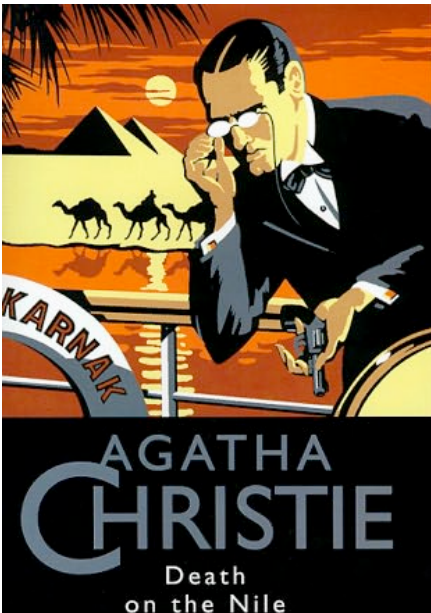


JUNG, MYTH & MYSTERY FICTION
